
The facilitators interacted with the audience, providing insights and answering questions on the topic. The participants were also encouraged to

The tree planting exercise stands as a reminder of


the collective effort needed to protect and preserve the environment for future generations.

IMPORTANT NOTIFICATIONS

1. DISCONTINUATION OF THE ALTERNATIVE BANK POCKET PAL ACCOUNT INITIATIVE/ INTRODUCTION OF A NEW POCKET MONEY STRUCTURE

Recall that in September 2024, the college management introduced the Alternative Bank Pocket Pal Account initiative to enhance the efficiency of pocket money operations within the institution, particularly for boarding students. The initiative was designed to provide a seamless system for students to access their funds and enable parents to track their ward(s)' spending amongst other crucial reasons.

However, since its inception, the college has encountered persistent challenges that contradict the intended benefits of the initiative. These challenges include excessive ATM Card processing charges, exorbitant POS transaction fees at the Tuck Shop, delays in card production, and other operational inefficiencies. Despite several engagements with the bank to resolve these issues, they have remained unresolved, leading to disruptions in the smooth operation of the initiative.

In view of these challenges and after a thorough review, the college management has decided to discontinue the Alternative Bank Pocket Pal Account initiative with immediate effect. As an alternative, the college has introduced a new structure where students will use branded paper money and pocket money cards for all purchases at the Tuck Shop. Under this new system, each student from JS1 to SS3 will receive a maximum amount of №3,000 per week, which will be issued by the account department of the college.

Henceforth, parents are to take note that all subsequent pocket money payments for their ward(s) should not be effected into the Alternative Bank account or the college's UBA account but should be made exclusively to the **GTBank account** details provided below.

3. SCHOOL UNIFORM

Parents/guardians are to ensure the replacement of worn out uniforms of their wards as some students have been observed to be using either torn or non-customized school cardigan, sportswear, trousers/skirt and stockings. At TAIDOB, appearance matters a lot, it commands respect and dignity. Parents/guardians are therefore advised to make their wards wear only the approved and appropriate uniform. Non-compliance by any student will be frowned at by the school authority during the upcoming term.

4. DEPOSIT OF ITEMS AT THE SECURITY CHECK POINT BY PARENTS

Parents/guardians are to note that only essential items (e.g. table/sachet water and educational materials such as textbooks, calculator etc.) will be accepted by the college's

security men at the security check point and must be deposited between 9:00am and 5:00pm with such items being properly tagged in the child's name for easy identification. Please note that while cooked food will not be accepted at all, provisions and other edible items would not be accepted from parents by the college's security men for use of boarding students on an intermittent basis. We therefore enjoin parents/guardians to provide the items needed by their wards in reasonable and sufficient quantities either at the beginning of the term, during visiting days or during the half term break.

5. SECURITY CLEARANCE CARD

Unless the Lord watches over a city, the watchman stays awake in vain. The security situation in Nigeria continues to be a significant concern for its citizens. As such, parents and guardians are encouraged to provide proper orientation, enlightenment, and guidance to their wards on the importance of being security-conscious.

To ensure the safety of everyone, the college management has implemented several measures, including the mandatory use of the Security Exeat Card by all parents and guardians (boarding and day students) when visiting the college. This applies during visiting days, resumption days, or any other official events requiring their presence for picking up or returning their wards.

We kindly urge all parents to adhere to the security guidelines outlined by the college's security committee. Your cooperation is vital in maintaining a secure environment for everyone.

6. ARBITRARY REQUEST FOR PERMISSION BY PARENTS AFTER EXAMINATION

We wish to inform our Parents that the College Management will no longer accept arbitrary request for Permission by parents to release their wards after School Examinations. This is because students will still be engaged with series of Academic activities even after their Examinations. We expect that parents cooperate with the School Management in this regard.

7. BROAD CONCEPT INTERNATIONAL AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP HUB

The college is still committed to producing entrepreneurs of international standard who will constantly add value to the community wherever they find themselves.

TOOL KIT

The relevance of having a tool kit to the effective realization of the goal of training cannot be overemphasized. It has been observed that a few students are yet to procure their training kits and this has affected the rate at which they learn as practice they say makes perfection. It is only when a trainee has personal material with which he/she can practice whatever he/she has been taught that learning becomes permanent. We therefore implore all parents to procure the required kits for their wards.

TERMLY TRAINING FEE IN ROBOTICS & ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE AND CATERING & CONFECTIONERIES

Students undergoing training in Robotics & Artificial Intelligence and Catering & Confectioneries are by policy of the institute expected to pay a subsidized termly training fee of N20, 000 and N6, 000 respectively. This is owing to humongous amount required for setting up and getting professional trainers in the field. It is our interest that any student who subscribes to this programme does not miss out at any point on the account of default to meet the financial commitment. To this end, parents are implored to make payment for their wards' training fee in earnest as only those with evidence of payment will be allowed into the unit.

8. ILLICIT ACTS ON SOCIAL MEDIA

It has been observed that students are engaging in illicit affairs via the social media platforms on the mobile phones made available to them by their parents. In order to curb this, the Management is advising parents to withdraw access to all forms of communication gadgets at home. Any student found on any of the social media platforms e.g. Instagram, Tik-Tok, Messenger, Facebook, X, WhatsApp etc. will be seriously dealt with. Parents are advised to ensure strict compliance in respect to this.

9. BED SPREAD

The usage of customized bedspread is compulsory for all boarding students. The College has made provision for this and parents are enjoined to purchase for their children, as no students will be allowed to use non-customized bed spreads henceforth.

10. WILLFUL DAMAGE OF ASSET

The management has observed with concern the willful damage of school assets by some students. Henceforth, any student found responsible for such damages will be surcharged, and the payment must be made into the school's account before the term's vacation.

Please note that students who fail to comply will have their report cards withheld. We appreciate your cooperation in maintaining the integrity of our school environment.

11. WITHDRAWAL OF WARD FROM THE COLLEGE

In as much as we cannot dictate to any parent on his/her choice to withdraw his/her ward from the College, we strongly frown at arbitrary withdrawal of students from the College as it adversely affects our plans and programs against a new term or session.

In view of this, parents/guardians wishing to withdraw their children/wards from the College must forward a term's notice (three months) in writing to the Management. A penal fee of N15, 000.00 per student is to be paid in lieu of notice in the event of default. Parent/guardians whose wards are in their terminal classes (JS3 and SS3) should note that this information also applies to them.

12. CHANGE OF WARDS FROM DAY TO BOARDING AND VICE-VERSA

This is to remind all Parents/Guardians that students registered as day or boarding students are not allowed to change their status until the end of the session. This is to allow for effective planning and implementation.

However, any Parent/guardian, who in the course of the session, has to change his/her ward(s') status especially from Boarding to Day will still have to continue to pay his/her ward's School fees as a boarder till the end of the session. <u>Please be informed</u>.

13. BARBING IN THE HOSTEL

Consequently, the College Management has approved for every parent to come with clipper on visiting days for his or her child/children to have their haircut.

Note: All students should barb a <u>uniformly low cut hairstyle</u> as other forms of hairstyle will not be allowed by the College Management.
